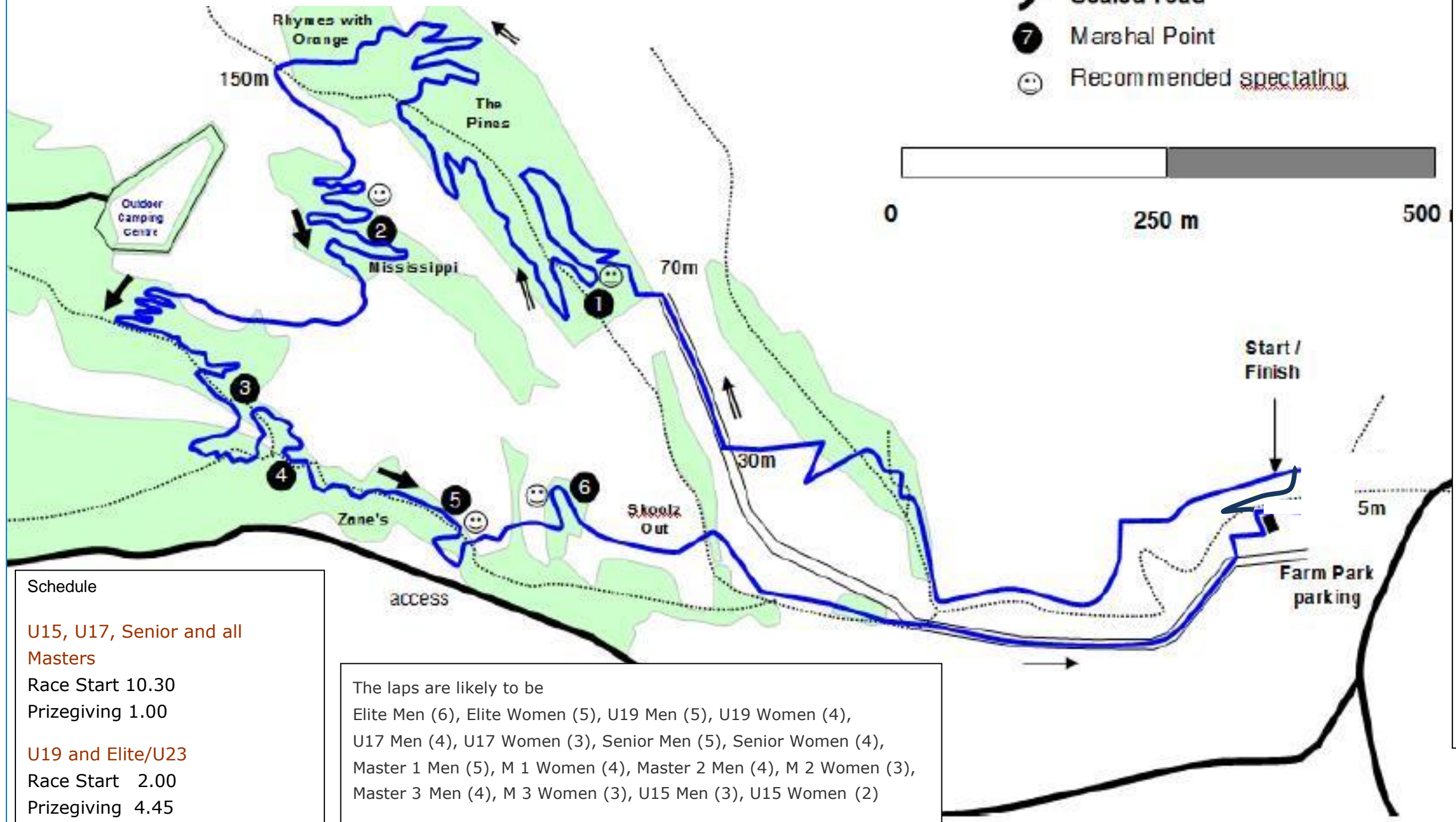


NZ MTB Cup Spectator Guide – Living Springs 22 Jan 2012

Other things to watch out for: Be careful of Ongaonga (below left). It has a nasty sting and is common in this area. The New Zealand Red Admiral is a butterfly that is endemic to New Zealand. The Māori name is kahukura which means red cloak. Ongaonga is the main food plant for Red Admiral larvae. Wood pigeons (kererū) often watch activity on the tracks below and you can frequently hear the call of the Bellbird (Korimako or Makomako). The District Lockup, 1877, is across the road from the carpark. This is the only remaining building from a police station erected there. The lockup was used for runaways from ships, prisoners coming in from the peninsula, and local trouble makers and drunks
